Industrialisation	Urbanisation
 Industrialisation is a process of social and economic change whereby a human society is transformed from a State pre-industrial to an industrial. 	Urbanisation is a two-way process that involves movement from villages to cities and change from agricultural occupation to business, trade, service and profession and change in the migrants' attitudes, beliefs, values and behavioural patterns.


Urbanisation


Solution:

Reason: Modernisation is the process of social change whereby less developed societies acquire the characteristics, common to more developed societies. There is a willingness to receive new ideas, examine alternatives, find new pathways etc. In short, people are ready to try new things. Being 'modern' involves adopting rational outlook and changes in a way of social life. The clothes that one wears indicates his values, beliefs etc. and hence, indicate the level of his modernisation.
