- 1. c. Young population, **Explanation:** The Indian population is young population as large number of population belongs to age group of 35 to 50 years.
- d. Both assertion and reason are correct, Explanation: The statutory ban on amniocentesis for sex determination is due to increasing female foeticide after knowing the sex of baby using the chromosomal pattern of amniotic fluid surrounding the foetus.
- 3. b. Artificial insemination, **Explanation:** Artificial insemination is not a contraceptive device. It is a assisted reproductive technologies for infertile people. Natural method, barrier method and surgical methods are categories of contraceptive method.
- d. Surrogate mother, Explanation: Sometimes egg of female and sperm of male are able to produce but fallopian tube is either blocked or uterus is not capable of implantation. In this case, ovum collected from female and sperm collected from male is fertilized and transferred to another female called surrogate mother for further development.
- 5. c. Hygienic condition, **Explanation:** The consequence of overpopulation includes unemployment, price rise, and energy crisis. Hygienic condition is not directly affected by overpopulation.

 Menstruation is the process of the shedding of the uterine lining on a regular monthly basis. It begins at puberty and is the reproductive cycle of the female body. Every month, the uterus prepares itself to receive a fertilized egg.
 - However due to lack of education in many parts of the country people practise such cult practises for example- Not letting them enter kitchen. Awareness plays an important role here. Small groups in the society should be set up to make people more aware about the phenomena.
- 11. Yes, It will provide right information about sex to the children. Such education will also discourage children from believing in myth and misconception about sex related aspects.
- 12. It is because an ideal contraceptive should be (i) user friendly (ii) with no or least side effect (iii) should not interfere with sexual drive, desire and the sexual act of the user. When gonads are removed, the basic function of reproductive system such as secretion of hormones and gamete production is not possible.
- 13. Saheli is the new oral contraceptive for the female which contains a non steroidal preparation called **centchroman**. It is a once a week pill with very few side effects and high contraceptive value.
 - Saheli was developed by scientists at Central Drug Research Institute (CDRI) in Lucknow.
- 14. They are used in the form of tablets is which contain progesterone and estrogen. Pills have to be taken daily for a period of 21 days starting within the first five days of menstrual cycle. They inhibit ovulation and implantation.

 Common pills are Mala D, Saheli.
- 15. The following aspects of reproductive health need to be given special attention in the present scenario:

- i. Educating married couples about available birth control options, care of pregnant mothers, postnatal care of mother and child and importance of breast feeding.
- ii. Equal opportunities should be given to male and female child in Education, Employments etc.
