In the 1960s, in Montgomery, Alabama, a young woman boarded a bus. She quietly occupied a seat and kept to herself. However, soon enough, a man entered the bus and condescendingly asked her to give up her seat so that he could occupy it. Why did he make such a demand?

It was because he, as a white man, felt he deserved the seat more than the African-American woman. But contrary to his expectations, the woman refused to give up the seat. She envisioned a world different from the existing racial order and thus took an action different from the world.

Her defiance marked sparked a turning point in the Civil Rights Movement. Today, she is remembered as the legendary Rosa Parks who dared to be different in hopes of creating a different world with greater equity for all races.

In light of the same this essay aims to explore the need to be different if one wants to change the world. We begin by understanding what it means to be different and to make a difference. Then we explore how being different has in the past helped alter the world. But, next we ask - Is being different always good for the world? Finally, we discuss what lessons we can derive from this essay.

Being Different and Making a Difference

Let us first understand what it means to make a difference in the world. Simply put, making a difference means that our actions altered the current state of affairs.

It involves transforming society from an older position to a newer one. While sometimes this change is favourable, as in the case of Rosa Parks, at other times it may be undesirable. We will explore both these facets in this essay.

But the path ~~that makes~~ to making a difference begins by being different ourselves. Being different from the world involves having an outlook, attitude, perspective, or belief that is contrary to most people around you. It means foregoing the 'herd mentality' and charting out your own path.

With these definitions in mind, let us now take a deep dive into understanding how being different is crucial to making a difference.

The Journey from Being Different to Making a Difference

Steve Jobs, the mastermind behind the modern technology giant Apple had once said -

“Those who are crazy enough to think they can change the world are the ones who change it”

This quote highlights the importance of being 'crazy' i.e. being different if one wants to bring a difference in the world. This is so because when we are different from the world, we challenge the status quo, and this spark can change the world.

Perhaps the best known example of the same is that of Mauryan Emperor Ashoka. After the Battle of Kalinga, he felt great remorse and vowed to change the world by making it more peaceful. But how did he do so? He did so by being different from all his contemporary rulers and foregoing Bherighosha in favour of Dhammaghosha. His message of peace and Buddhism spread far and wide into central and Eastern Asia where it survives even in the present day. To His different outlook created a different world marked by greater peace.

Ashoka's spirit of being different was also replicated by Pakistani activist Malala Yousafzai. As a teenager living in Swat Valley, she chose to act different from people around ^{when} ^{she} campaigned for female education in ^{her} Taliban infested region. She even took a bullet in her head for the same!

By pursuing the different action of raising her voice against the terrorist groups, she changed the world by attracting international attention to her cause.

Similarly, Indian business giant Reliance has leveraged the power of standing out. As late as the early 2010s, India had one of the most expensive internet services in the world. Then, Reliance adopted a different strategy from its counterparts when it launched Jio that provided internet services at highly economical prices. This was unlike anything the Indian markets had seen previously. Today, Reliance's different strategy

of providing accessible internet has made a difference by not just raising Reliance's market dominance, but more importantly ensuring India has one of the cheapest internet services in the world.

More recently, this principle was also applied by Indian administrators in flood ravaged Northern India. Specifically, five IAS officers - collectively called the "Wonder Women of Punjab" adopted the different method of foregoing the safety of their offices to work at the ground level even during disastrous floods. By adopting this different method of public service delivery during a disaster, they changed the world by saving countless lives.

Finally, not just at the individual level, but also at the national level, being

different can help alter the world. Despite pressure from Western powers, India has chosen to be different by adopting the different approach of continuing to maintain trade ties, specifically oil purchases, from Russia even past the Ukraine war. This has made a difference in the world by protecting the strategic autonomy of the Global South and signalling that the era of Western dominance is coming to an end.

In all these instances, being different ~~reaped~~ created a positive difference in the world. But as George Bernard Shaw once said -

"Each good brings its own brand of evil".

In this light, let us explore the other side of 'being different' in the next section'

Being Different : All that Glitters is not Gold.

Despite the positive charge that comes with being different, there also exists a downside. Let us now try to understand this perspective.

Sometimes, focusing too much on difference and the need to stand out can harm societal harmony by pitting us against each other. The aggressions by Khalistani forces in foreign lands, the ongoing Kuki-Maitai dispute, and existence of regionalism often brings disrupts peace. It is also against the notions of 'brotherhood' and 'fraternity' imbued in our constitution.

Secondly, it is important to remember that -

"One and one make eleven"

That is, as a whole we are more powerful than as distant individuals marked by differences. Thus, an approach that sets aside differences and works towards common goals like climate change action and anti-terrorism will help change the world for the better.

Finally, despite differences, most people who manage to bring a difference in the world share some common traits like perseverence, dedication, and the ability to work hard.

With these thoughts in mind, how do we balance between being different and being alike?

that principle encourages one to not take extreme decisions, we ~~can~~ need to strike the correct balance in terms of being different:

When being different makes a desirable difference in the world, just as in the case of Ashoka, Jiddu, etc., it should be pursued. The courage of conviction can give us the support and strength needed to be different.

But simultaneously, when being different does more harm than good, we must leverage our emotional intelligence to gauge the damage of being different and refrain from doing so.

In light of the same, this essay explores how we must craft our own success if circumstances do not create it. First, we will understand the topic, after which we will examine how by seeking opportunities, rather than waiting for them we can ensure success. Then, we also acknowledge that sometimes seeking opportunities can be destructive in nature. We conclude by looking at the insights this essay leaves us with.

Swimming Out to Meet the Ship

former US President Abraham Lincoln
encouraged people to 'swim out' when he said -
'The best way to predict the future
is to create it'.

The Indian Freedom struggle is a
perfect example of the need to swim out.
Initially, the moderate Icd movement hoped
for change to come in from the side of
the colonial rulers. However, unsatisfactory
responses, half hearted reforms, and a
general apathy from ^{British} their end made it clear
that the ship of the moderates had not come in.

To reach the ship of swaraj, leaders like
Gandhi decided to swim out into
turbulent waters by launching a mass
movement which demanded, rather than
requested, independence. Had we waited
for the ship of swaraj, would we be
celebrating 76 years of freedom today?



A similar sentiment was harboured by American inventor Thomas Alva Edison. He faced countless challenges and endless failures while trying to invent the modern day light bulb. He himself admitted that he 'failed 10,000 times'. His ship of scientific success was clearly not coming in. But his endless perseverance allowed him to swim out to his ship and finally reach it. If he had waited for his ship to arrive, our homes might still have been deprived from the gift of light.

Closer home, India also decided to not wait for the ship to come in. After disastrous droughts that brought the Indian agricultural ^{sector} to its knees, India decided to take matters in her own hands. A science backed green revolution was launched to propel the economy towards

its ship of food security. By swimming out, India transformed itself from an import dependent nation in the 1960s to a major exporter of agricultural produce in present times.

This spirit of swimming towards the ship was also replicated many decades later by the Naz Foundation which played an instrumental role in the ~~striking~~ decriminalization of homosexuality in India. The ship of equality had not arrived for the LGBTQ+ community despite Articles 14–18 guaranteeing the Right to Equality in the Constitution. So, the Foundation chose to seek it by fighting a legal battle that struck down Article 377 of the IPC. Today, this 'swimming out' continues with ongoing Sugriyo Case which debates the legality of same sex marriages in India.

Finally, the ship of democratic rights is also being chased in many nations where it has not arrived. The widespread ongoing Iranian protests, in light of the death of Mahsa Amini, and the Umbrella Revolution which gained traction in Hong Kong from time to time are attempts to swim out to reach the ship they've been waiting for.

While these examples do encourage us to seek our own goals and create opportunities, is doing so always the right way forward?

The Other Side of the Coin

It is said Life is barely ever made up of black or white, but mostly by shades of grey. Similarly, while the swimming

In the world of sports while the chasing the ship of victory in highly competitive events, some sports people have ~~swim~~ swum out to this ship through unethical and illegal means. The notorious case of Lance Armstrong - who admitted to doping to win numerous Tour De France titles stands out. Others like ace tennis player Maria Sharapova have also been accused of the same.

Similarly, to reach the ship of financial strength, many continue to swim out by pursuing corrupt means.
