- Leeches are worms that live in water or on land and feed by sucking blood from fish, frogs, lizards, birds or, if they get the chance, larger animals like humans. They suck blood because it is a very good food source for them.

- Cats like to do things their own way, when it comes to drinking. Researchers have discovered that felines have their own style of lapping water. The cat's tongue makes only the briefest contact with the liquid's surface, before quickly retracting to pull a thin column of milk into the mouth.

**Answer:** When cud-chewing animals eat their food, some of the food is stored in a special pouch within its stomach. It later regurgitates this stored food, or cud, and begins to chew it again. Cattle, deer, sheep, goats and antelope are some examples of animals that chew their cud.

**Question 10:** Explain the eating habits of omnivorous animals.

**Answer:** Some animals, like crows, bears, dogs, cockroaches and humans, eat both plants and flesh of other animals. Examples of omnivores include bears, birds, dogs.

**Question 11:** All animals depend on plants for their food. How?

**Answer:** Animals get their energy from food. They get their energy from the sun, which allows them to manufacture the substances they need for their development. Most animals depend directly or indirectly on plants. In this way, even carnivores that feed on herbivores depend on the plants that feed their prey.

**Question 12:** What is a food chain?

**Answer:** A food chain is the transfer of food energy from plants to an animal and then to another animal. Food chains begin with plants (known as primary producers), followed by the animals that consume plants (primary consumers or herbivores), the animals that eat herbivores (secondary consumers), and so on.
