GOLU GROWS A NOSE



A1. Pre-reading

In this story you will know how the elephant came to have a long nose.


Then the teacher will tell the students to go for the silent reading of the text. While reading they will try to find the answer to the following questions: The questions may be put on the blackboard.

B1. Let's read the text.

The ostrich, the giraffe, the Hippopotamus and the baboon had no answer to Golu's questions, "Golu is a naughty baby," they said, "He asks such difficult questions".

"I want to know."


"Come close, little one, for I am the crocodile," and he shed crocodile tears 12 to show it was quite true.
