More land has been converted to agriculture since 1945 than in the 18th and 19th centuries put together, resulting in a substantial and largely irreversible loss in diversity of life on Earth. Up to 30% of the mammalian, bird and amphibian species are currently threatened with total extinction. That's enough evidence for experts to warn of the likelihood of potentially abrupt changes which could seriously affect human well-being, including the emergence of new diseases, sudden changes in water quality, creation of "dead zones" along coastlines and shifts in regional climate. More ominously, the assessment team warns that the ability of Earth's ecosystem to sustain future generations can no longer be taken for granted.

Having heard all this should our visiting ET give up all hope for the posterity of humankind and leave? 
