When television became widespread after World War-II, some people thought that television will replace reading. They believed that only a few people might still have any reason to read and that television would become the number one educational tool. This prediction proved incorrect. In fact, surveys show that more books than ever are being sold and the amount of time that students spend reading is greater than in the days before television. Unfortunately, however, many students are doing little or no voluntary reading. Most of the reading that they do is assigned by their teachers.

Just think about how much you read everyday in order to complete your school work. How often can you finish an assignment or your homework without doing any reading ? Is there nothing in your studies that does not require you to do some reading ? There is no denying the fact that most academic and vocational courses rely heavily on text-books.

Recently, a group of teachers made a study of the students and their learning problems. They discovered that some students did poorly in Maths or Art, but could still do well in other subjects. Much of the homework or assignment work require students to read long sets of directions, tests and understanding the reading hints. meaningful assignment and it would bring you more of applause by your teacher as a return reward, otherwise your assignment would be weak, scattered and useless only saving you from the scolding of your teacher

4 Success in school courses still depends on an ability to read and those students who cannot read or at the least reading to master material, are still in trouble. You are moving into a world where everyday more and more technical reading is required. Instructions for using applications are becoming more complex. There are written instructions to follow for food preparations, traffic signs, travelling and safety norms etc. All these require the ability to read.
