Rise of the Phoenix

Arvind Kejriwal got unprecedented mandate in 2015 Delhi Legistative Assembly Election. I couldn't keep my hands off his political career.

Election fever had been at its peak in many states but AAP's rise in a trice' inspite of many Trojan horses2 causing teething troubles3 to the party made Delhi Assembly election a hot potato4. Delhi, that saw congress rule the roost5 thrice, this time sent it packing lock, stock and barrel6. This election was a two horse race7, between AAP and BJP. BJP's performance proved to be a damp squib8 and Congress has now met its waterloo9. Both will have to cool their heels 10 for the next five years. The brown sturdy11 of Congress, an age-old party, turned into a nightmare12 in 2012 when Anna Hazare blazed the trail18 that saw unprecedent14 big draw15. By and by16 the movement gained momentum17, Anna banking on18 his faithful camaraderie19 set the Thames on fire20. He stole his rivale thunder21 because he is aboveboard22 and speaks straight from the show lors 23. His fast unto death ruffled quite a few feathers24 among the ech-!--- of power but the rot set in26 the movement when later Arvind Vijimal's fast didn't steal a march on27 his predecessor28 Anna Hazare. Nine days of fast proved ploughing the sands29 and Congress for the whole time played fast and loose 30 and turned a deaf ear 31 to his demands. The meritocrais32 of the movement put their heads together33 and soon rose to the occasion 34 and formed a political party AAP. This off-hand35 decision of the green horns36 rubbed Anna the wrong way37. He put his foot down38 but now none of his zealots39 except Kiran Bedi and a few was ready to invest time and energy in a Quixotic40 project. The movement finally petered out" and a new party saw the light of the day".

The debutant⁴³ Arvind Kejriwal in his speeches portrayed India as a banana republic⁴⁴ and the public especially the youths went bananas⁴⁵. He insisted that it is barking up the wrong tree⁴⁶ if we try to clean the dirt of politics without entering it. He said that the Congress Party had a ball⁴⁷ and now will have to take a back seat⁴³. Soon a whole new ball game⁴⁹ started when General Assembly Election was announced in 2013. Kejriwal emerged as a dark horse⁵⁰ with 28 seats for the AAP in his kitty⁵¹. The BJP leaders who were waiting for the result with bated breath⁵² without an iota⁵³ of doubt that it's their turn now was in for a shock⁵⁴ and the result was a bolt from the blue⁵⁵ for them. The Congress of course had to bite the dust⁵⁶ as it got the boot from the public⁵⁷ and could bag just 8 seats. The blood, sweat and tears⁵⁸ of the volunteers of AAP bore fruits⁵⁹. Kejriwal was their blue-eyed boy⁵⁰ but he was a new kid on the block⁶¹. Overnight he became a big cheese⁶² when he became the CM with the support of the Congress. Though he remained betwixt and between⁶³ for sometime but ultimately he bit the builet⁶⁴, when on the ground of Jan Lokpal he fell on his sword⁶⁵ and the rein of Delhi went into the hands of the Central

Government. He beat a hasty retreat⁵⁶ from Delhi and went to contest Lok Sabha election from Varanasi. Overnight a man who became the CM in his first attempt turned into a laughingstock⁵⁷. He was perceived as a queer fish⁵⁸ who was considered habitual of picking holes⁶⁹ in every person. He who rubbed the blue blood⁷⁰ of the Congress party the wrong way⁷¹ was now trying to put a spoke in the wheel⁷² of the winning spree⁷³ of the past master⁷⁴ of tact, Mr. Narendra Modi, the leading light⁷⁸ of the BJP. Kejriwal threw down the gauntlet⁷⁶ by filing his nomination from Varanasi. When the result came he had to eat humble pie¹⁷. The whole hullabaloo⁷⁸ proved to be a damp squib. The media that were all eyes⁷⁹ during the Lok Sabha election wrote him off⁸⁰ and many of his bosom friends⁹¹ deserted him hook, line and sinker⁸². Kejriwal was ridiculed⁸³ on all social media but the iron willed⁸⁴ man rose to the occasion⁸⁵ and his steady⁸⁶ efforts caught eyes of⁸⁷ the common public by and by. His fast and furious⁸⁴ campaigns and down to earth⁸⁹ attitude was a far cry⁹⁰ from what it was earlier when he accused and blamed every Tom, Dick and Harry⁹¹. The result of the Delhi Assembly election sealed the fate⁹² of all oppositions and the man who got the flak⁹³ a few months ago was received with open arms⁹⁴.

Certainly this common man's CM is here to stay⁹⁵ and change the gear of governance⁹⁶. Hope this time the Delhi government goes great guns⁹⁷ but of course the high expectations of the people will keep the CM under the gun⁹⁸. Kejriwal, once bitten twice shy⁹⁹ will hopefully pick up the pieces¹⁰⁰ and start afresh, though he knows, it will not be that plain sailing¹⁰¹.

Sweat of the brow

'Children of lesser god' too need equal attention.

Child labourers and their exploiters are ubiquitous1 not only pan India2 but also throughout the world. From pacdophilic3 to sadist4 the exploiters can be of any type and the problem is aggravating day by day. You can twist the world around your little finger if you have gift of the gab.




