- 2. Answers
- a. Mrs. Slater is doubtful about her sister and her husband, Jordans arrival at grandfather's demise. Mrs. Slater is also anxious about grandfather's insurance premium and looks for it. She also brings grandfather's bureau down from his room. Before her sister arrived, she tried to have every asset of grandfather in possession. She is a ruthless and self-centered person.
