Explanations

- 1. a 'To despair over something' is the right use of the preposition.
- 2. b Council takes plural verb 'are' because the sentence talks about members who have different views.
- 3. a After the modifier clause, the noun being modified 'my friend' should immediately succeed the modifier clause.
- 4. b 'Since' indicates a point of time when the action began and has continued till the present.
- 5. b 'has been gossiping' shows a continuous action that is still going on.
- 6. b 'had arrived' is the correct phrase. When the adverb clause of time is in the simple past tense (reached), the main clause must be in the past perfect tense.
- c Use 'the oldest manuscript' as 'elder' and 'eldest' apply to persons only.
- 8. c The correct phrase is 'those of any other dramatist' as the comparison is between the plays of Moliere and those of other dramatists.
- 9. c 'A unique insect' should be used as unique expresses a superlative meaning. Hence, we cannot say most unique (two superlatives can't be together).

- 10. a 'He' as a singular subject will take the singular verb 'has'.
- 11. d Replace 'one another' by 'each other' because the reference is only to two persons.
- 12. d The subject of the clause is a singular one, i.e. 'safety'. Hence, the singular auxiliary verb 'was' will be used.
- 13. c 'had gone' is the past perfect tense and is the correct usage.
- 14. a The definite article 'the' should be used before judge.
- 15. b 'There is no news today'. News is a singular noun. It always takes a singular verb.
- 16. d An audit is a check to determine whether things are done properly. So, its opposite is 'overlook'.
- 17. d 'authentic' means genuine, its opposite is 'duplicate'.
- 18. b An avid person is active. Its opposite is passive.
- 19. b To baffle is to confuse someone. 'clarify' is its opposite.
- 20. c 'baleful' means being evil or destructive in influence. Hence, its opposite is 'benign', which means being gentle.
