The Talkative Turtle

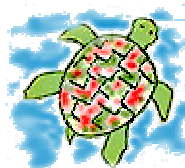

VEGETABLE KINGDOM

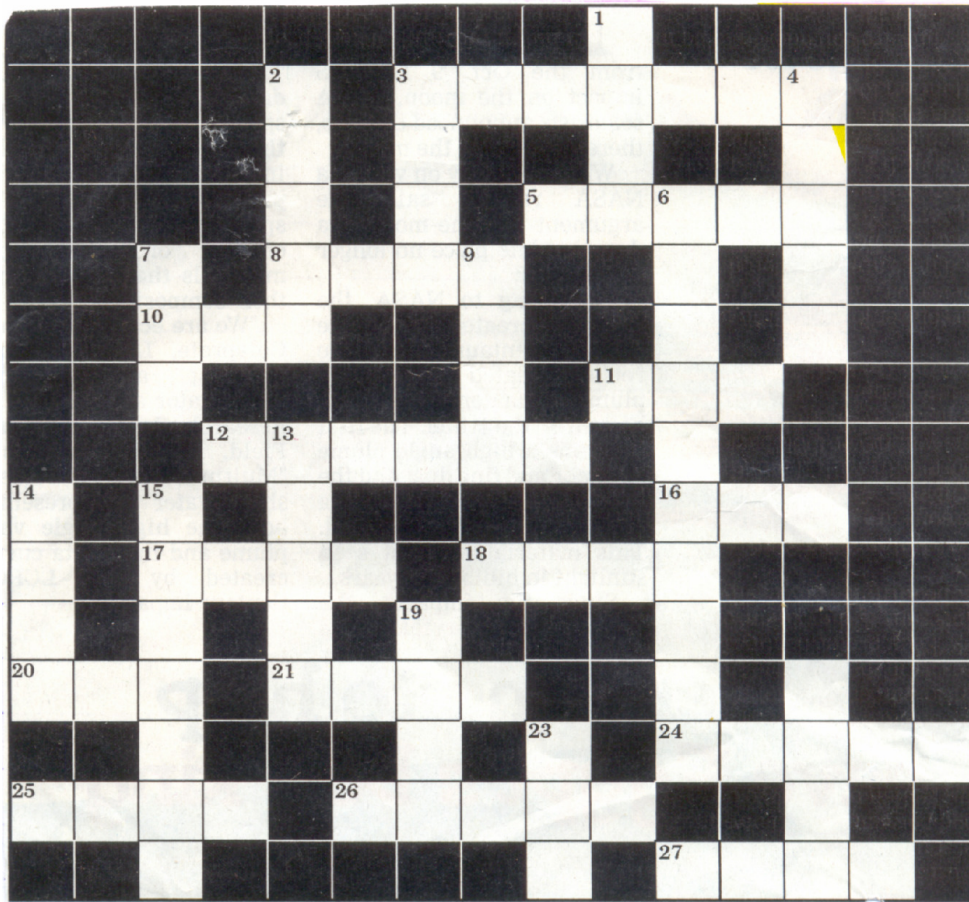
Carrot, cabbage, and potato,
