



THE FOOLISH TORTOISE

Sage 1. Pre-reading

Activity 1. Talking about the topic

The teacher asks some of the children individually:

- (i) Do you have friends?
- (ii) How many friends do you have in the class?
- (iii) Why do we have friends? Are they necessary in life?

Activity 2. Listening to the story

The teacher tells the children: "You are going to read a story about three friends. But first listen to the story."

The teacher then reads out the first part of the story while the children listen with their books closed.

THE FOOLISH TORTOISE

Part 1

Two swans lived on the shore of a large lake. One was named Slim and the other was named Trim. In the same lake there lived an old tortoise. He was called Rocky because the shell that covered his back was as hard as a rock. Rocky, Slim and Trim were good

friends. They would meet every afternoon and chat for a long time. They lived happily together.

One year, there was no rain. There was also no rain for the next ten years. The water of the lake dried up.



Slim and Trim were very unhappy. There was no water for them to swim in. "We can't live here any longer," Slim said to Trim. "We must find a new home."

So Slim and Trim flew away to look for a new home. They found another lake. It was full of water. But it was very far away from their old home.

They came back to their home.

"We have found a new home," Trim told Rocky. "We will leave this place today. Good bye, my friend!"



"What is that strange animal which they are carrying?" another boy said. "How ugly it is! It must be a frog!"


Rocky was very angry when the boy called him a frog.





Activity 12. Exclamations

The teacher explains:

Look at these two sentences from the story:

How beautiful the swans look!

How ugly the tortoise is!

Both these sentence begin with the word "how", and at the end of each sentence, you find a mark which looks like this: !

This is called an **exclamation mark.** Sentences of this kind are called **exclamations.**

An exclamation is a sentence which expresses a strong feeling of surprise, wonder, joy, admiration etc. Most exclamations begin with the words "how" or "what".

Here are some more examples of exclamations, together with the feeling that is expressed in each sentence:

How tall you have become! (surprise)

How big the ocean is! (wonder)

What a clever boy you are! (admiration)

How happy I am to see you! (joy)
