

LESSON - 6

IGE-GREAM MAN

A. Pre-reading

ACTIVITY - 1:

The teacher says to the students:

"I am going to tell you a riddle".

Listen and tell me what it is."

ACTIVITY-2:

The teacher asks the following questions:

Do you like ice-cream?

Have you ever met a man selling ice-cream on a cart or tricycle?

What is he called?

Let us now read a poem about the ice-cream man.

ACTIVITY - 3:

Students close their books.

The teacher reads the poem aloud. Students listen to their teacher.

The teacher will ask these questions after reading the poem aloud.

- a) Do you see the Ice-cream man only in summer?
- b) Who are the other people you find in the poem?
- c) What are the things you see in the poem?

If most of the students do not know the answers, then they are asked to read the poem silently to get the right answers.
