The private sector is all set to pitch in particularly to help the underprivileged sections of society. The Bangalore based Narayana Hrudayalaya hospitals plans to commission a low-cost heart hospital in Mysore for the working class and poor.

"We believe that the cost of building a heart hospital should be a quarter of what is currently required. This is the only way to bring down the cost of heart surgery," says Dr. Devi Prasad Shetty of Narayana Hrudayalaya.

The institution is working with the L & T to build this hospital, which will be built in less than five months because most of it is prefabricated. Including equipment it should cost about Rs. 20 crores. If this is done, the hospital would like to reproduce this model with 300 beds in 50 cities across the country where there is no access to heart care. India requires 2.5 million heart surgeries a year and currently all the heart hospitals in the country put together perform less than 90,000. All the other victims of heart attack suffer and die gradually over a period of time.

Unlike in the West, heart disease in India is not confined to the old and the retired. It is a disease of the young breadwinners. If a low-cost heart hospital model can be developed and implemented successfully, we would have changed the healthcare is delivered, Dr. Devi Shetty explains, "India produces the largest number of doctors, nurses and medical technicians in the world. Unfortunately we also face an acute shortage of hospital beds. In the process, talented doctors do not get a platform to show their talent. We believe this low cost heart hospital will address this shortage", he says.

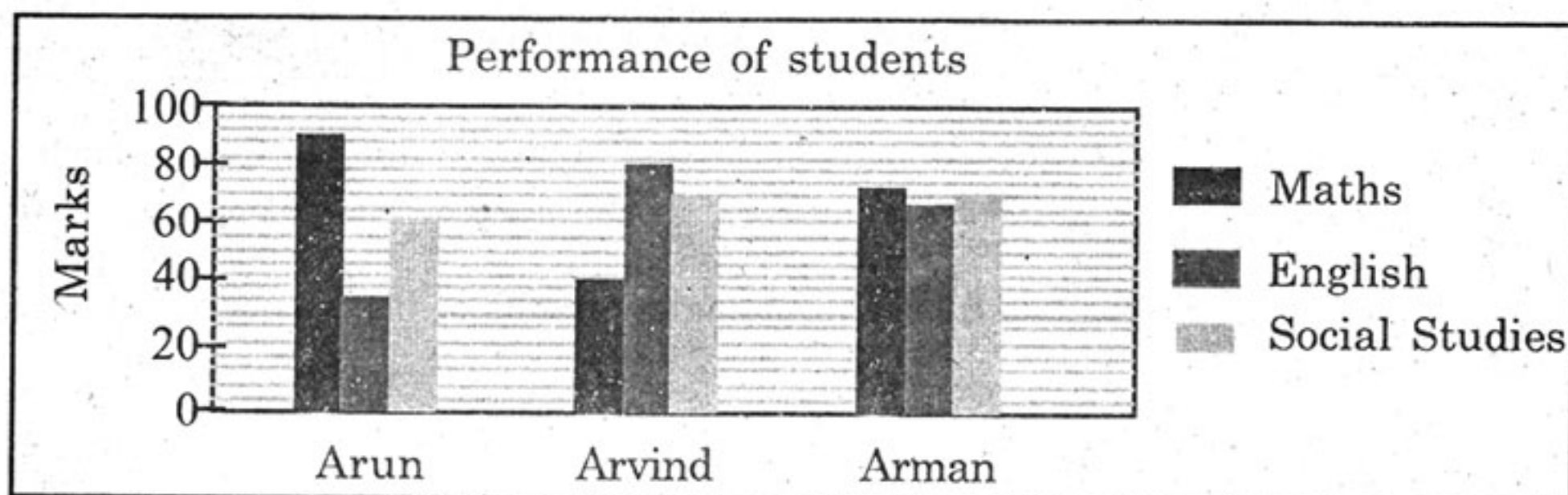
