


## Lesson - 2

# Animals around us




One day, on her way to school, Sikhamoni saw two fishermen catching fish with net on a roadside pond. The two fishermen were collecting the fish from the net and putting them inside a bamboo basket. They kept aside the frogs that got caught in the net. Sikhamoni noticed that when the frogs were left unattended on the ground, they started jumping here and there. Few frogs jumped back into the water and started swimming. Two fish also remained unnoticed on the ground along with the frogs. One of the fish somehow fell into the water. Once in water the fish began

to swim and went far into the middle of the pond. But the fish which was lying on the ground was flittering and flopping. Sikhamoni observed this and wondered, "Why do fish live only in water while frogs can live both on land and in water." She was curious to know about it. On reaching school, she decided to ask her teacher. Let us now read what Sikhamoni's teacher told her and her classmates .



Have you ever noticed how fish swim in water? If you observe carefully, you will notice that the middle portion of the body of a fish is wide. The front and lower portion are narrow and small. Fish swim with the help of fins and also with the help of its tail which is on the lower side. Have you noticed the red colour gills present inside the fish ears? Fish breathe in water with the help of these gills. They cannot live without water. This was why the fish which Sikhamoni saw lying on the ground was finding it difficult to breathe and it started to flutter. Fishes live in water so they are called **aquatic animal**.




Look at the frog's legs in the given picture. Have you noticed the webbed feet of the frog? The webbed feet of the frog helps them to swim in water. The legs of the frog also help them to jump on land. While on land, frogs breathe through their lungs and when they are in water they respire with the help of their skin. Frogs can live both on land and in water so they are called **amphibians**.

We often see animals such as cow, horse, goat, dog, cat, etc., around us in the fields, on roads, in rivers and ponds. Don't we? There are some animals that live in forest like- tiger, lion, deer, etc. These animals live only on land so they are called **terrestrial animal**. Most of the terrestrial animals have legs. With the help of legs they can walk and run.

Among the terrestrial animals or land animals some are domestic and some are wild. Animals that live in our homes are called domestic animals.



People build places for domestic animals to live. On the other hand, wild animals live in the forest. Wild animals arrange their own food and habitats.


Some animals live in homes made of mud or earth. Ants live in anthills. Animals such as earthworm, mole, cricket, etc. cannot live under direct sunlight. So they live under the soil.

Frog, rabbit, sparrows, etc move by jumping and hopping from one place to another. Lizards can crawl on walls. Do you know why? The lower part of their legs are structured in such a way that they can crawl without difficulty even on stiff and straight surface. Snake, crocodile, chameleon are examples of few animals who can crawl and move.





Birds can fly with the help of their wings and the feathers on their tail. Their bones are hollow so their body is light.

The wings of the birds like crow, common wagtail (Balimahi) etc, have strong wings so they can fly to distant places.



You must have seen some birds flying very high up in the sky. Do you know the names of these birds? Vulture, eagle are birds that can fly very high up in the sky.



Some birds cannot fly. For example Ostrich and Penguin. Ostrich is the largest bird in the world. Ostrich can walk as well as run very fast. Penguin can walk and they can also swim with the help of their wings.
