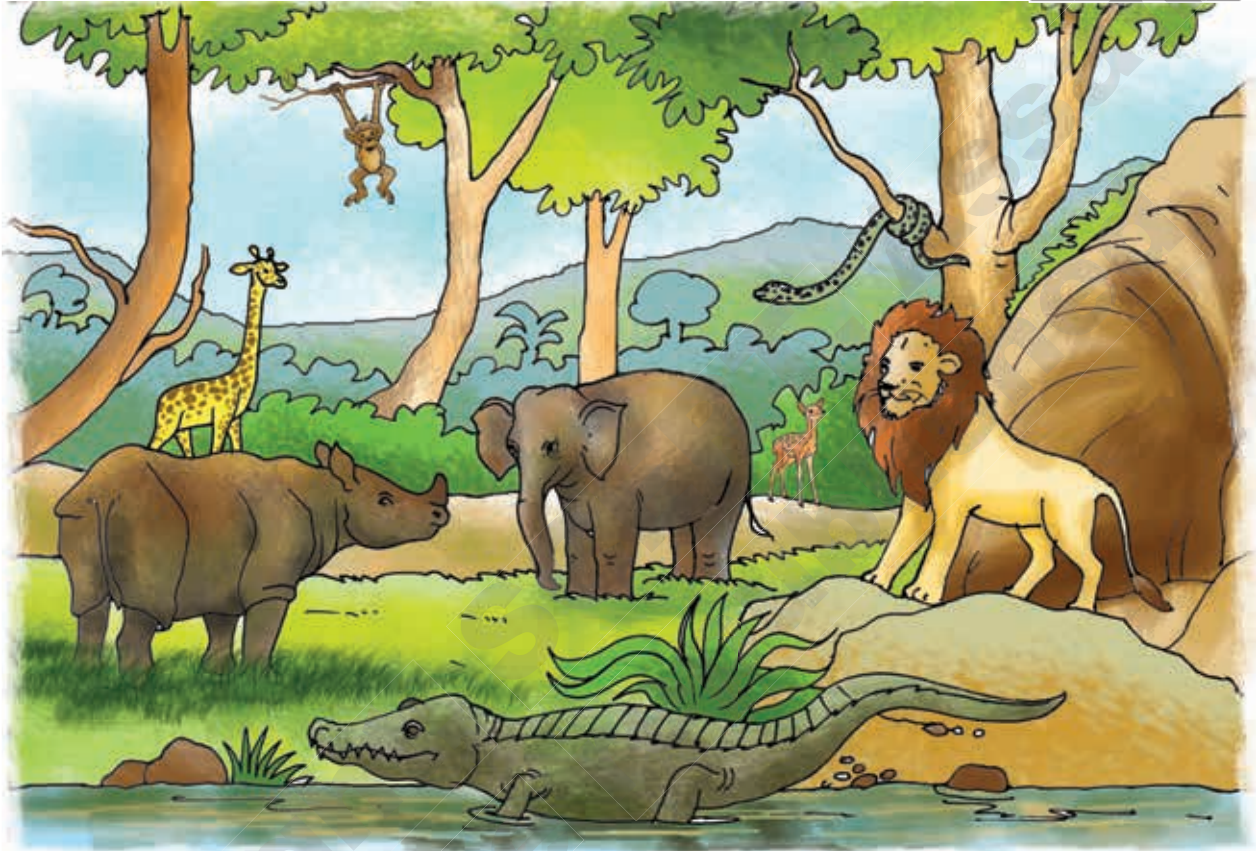


Lesson 3

Lesson 3

For the Teacher

This lesson is a good opportunity for introducing learners to different language skills. The picture at the beginning of this lesson exposes learners to the animal world.

Enhancing speaking

The teachers will ask a number of questions related to this picture. In the process, learners will be able to identify animals and their special features and learn their names viz – mane, trunk, horn, tail, neck, etc. Teachers may extend this activity by asking them questions about other animals in the jungle or in the zoo. Teachers will also help learners to differentiate between domestic and wild animals.

Storytelling

“The Lion and the Mouse” is an interesting input for developing listening ability in learners. The teacher will tell the story with correct pronunciation, voice modulation, gestures and proper stress and intonation. The teacher will then encourage learners to recall and retell the story in simple sentences and also respond to comprehension questions in the Activity that follows.

In Activity 18, the teacher will help learners write 1,2,3,4 and 5 in the boxes according to proper sequence of the story. Learners will be encouraged to identify new words and associate them with pictures.

Rhyme time

Teachers will help learners to say and repeat rhyming words. Teachers will also produce beginning sounds in words like – LION, MOUSE, NET and JUNGLE and learners will repeat them. The teacher will recite the poem ‘Red Roses’ in rhythm and correct pronunciation, which the learners will repeat, first collectively and then individually.

Pair work

Learners will be arranged into pairs for performing activities and the teachers will help them to match letters with pictures correctly.

Names and colours of flowers

Teachers will help learners to identify different types of flowers and their colours. The letter ‘Y’ will be taught through words like “YAK”, “YACHT” and “YO YO”.

Strokes for writing the alphabet will continue and teachers will help learners to find the letters like....M,N,O,P,Q,R ...and their sounds in different words.

Learning outcomes: The learner-

1. names familiar objects seen in the picture
2. responds orally to comprehension questions related to stories/poems
3. identifies characters and sequence of a story and asks questions about the story
4. recognizes letters and their sounds in context
5. differentiates between small and capital letters in print
6. associates words with pictures
7. recites poems/rhymes with actions
8. listens to English words, greetings, polite forms of expression, simple sentences and responds in English, home language or sign language
