- (2) A child learns from his adversities, vexations and difficulties and experiences, and though most parents bleed to see their wards in trouble, and make themselves available to render their helping hands to their needs; but that's not a practice worth appreciating. Let the meaning of growing progressively, independently, and responsibly be learnt by them and then they can emerge as a well-matured adult.
- (3) Wrong upbringing or overpampering spoils children. There is such a thing as overparenting, which can cripple children as they move into adulthood and render them unable to cope with the merest setbacks. There are enough evidence and circumstances which call attention that pampered children grow into egoistic and self-centred adults, insensitive to the idea of hurting others. Satisfying all realistic and unrealistic demands, not correcting or taking action, and treating the child as a fragile human being will infringe the definition of good parenting.

- (1) Overall global handset profits declined 11% year over year to USD 12 billion in Q3 2019 due to an increased mix of entry to mid-tier products and a fall in revenues for key smartphone OEMs (Original Equipment Manufacturer).
- (2) Apple dominates the global handset market by capturing 66% of industry profits and 32% of the overall handset revenue. The loyal premium user base in the major markets like the USA, EU and Japan is one of the reasons that Apple can still operate at a profit level that its competitors can only wish for. Now with a strong service strategy, Apple's overall ecosystem is strong enough to guarantee it a steady inflow of revenue in the coming years. In the immediate future, we believe that Apple's profit for the holiday season will increase with the new line up of iPhones gaining good traction.
- (3) Samsung is a distant second, taking 17% of the overall handset Industry profits. The increased mix of Galaxy A Series along with the positive start of Galaxy Note 10 Series was the key reason for the growth.
- (4) Chinese smartphone brands operate at low-profit margins, but better than in previous years, even though they are expanding outside China and also penetrating high-tier price bands. Chinese brands offer attractive propositions to mature smartphone users with new feature-packed flagships at affordable prices. Some of these Chinese brands are also now looking at monetizing their user base by launching services like financial services, IoT products and others. However, it is becoming a challenge for Chinese brands to increase their smartphone ASPs (Average Selling Price) and margins due to a combination of longer consumer holding periods and Apple lowering pricing on some key SKUs (Stock Keeping Unit), which has limited the headroom that Chinese vendors had used to increase their ASPs.



- Yoga is not a particular denomination or religion, but an age-old practice based on a harmonizing system for the body, mind, and spirit to attain inner peace and liberation.
- (2) Within the past decade, yoga has infiltrated not only Western culture, but also Western medicine. The more we learn about this ancient practice, the more we realize that its benefits go far beyond increased flexibility and muscle tone. A common misunderstanding is that yoga predominantly focuses on increasing flexibility; however, the physical practice of yoga, does emphasize appropriate postural alignment, musculoskeletal strength and endurance as well as balance. The study and practice of yoga incorporates mindfulness-based practices such as mindful breathing techniques, focused concentration, meditation and self-reflection.
- (3) We give undue importance to our health and the treatment of diseases. A large number of medicines treat only the symptoms of the disease, and not the root cause. In fact, the cause of many chronic ailments is still being researched. It is here that yoga therapy comes to our assistance. Yoga emphasizes treatment of the root cause of an ailment. It works in a slow, subtle and miraculous manner. Modern medicine can claim to save a life at a critical stage, but, for complete recovery and regaining of normal health, one must believe in the efficiency of yoga therapy.
