- 1. 'And then, just as he was going, he said, if I would care to meet him'. It means asking for a date. Sophie narrated her meeting with Danny Casey and through these words he offered her for a date. These days, it is common conversation when a boy and girl meet as they don't ask each other for a date directly.
- 2. Sophie didn't want to talk to Jansie about Danny Casey because she knew that Jansie was gawky and would reveal the secret to everyone in the neighborhood.
- 3. Sophie lied to her brother about Danny Casey because she was meeting Danny in her dreams. She wanted to prove to the world that her relationship with Danny was not restricted to dreams but was a reality. For her it was real.
