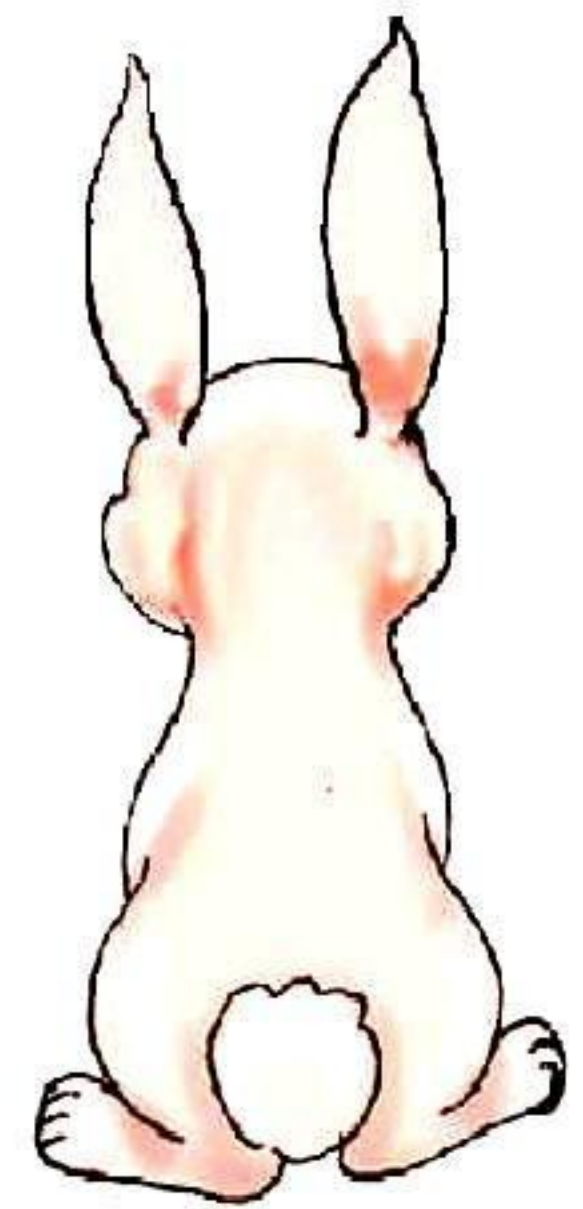
What is it?

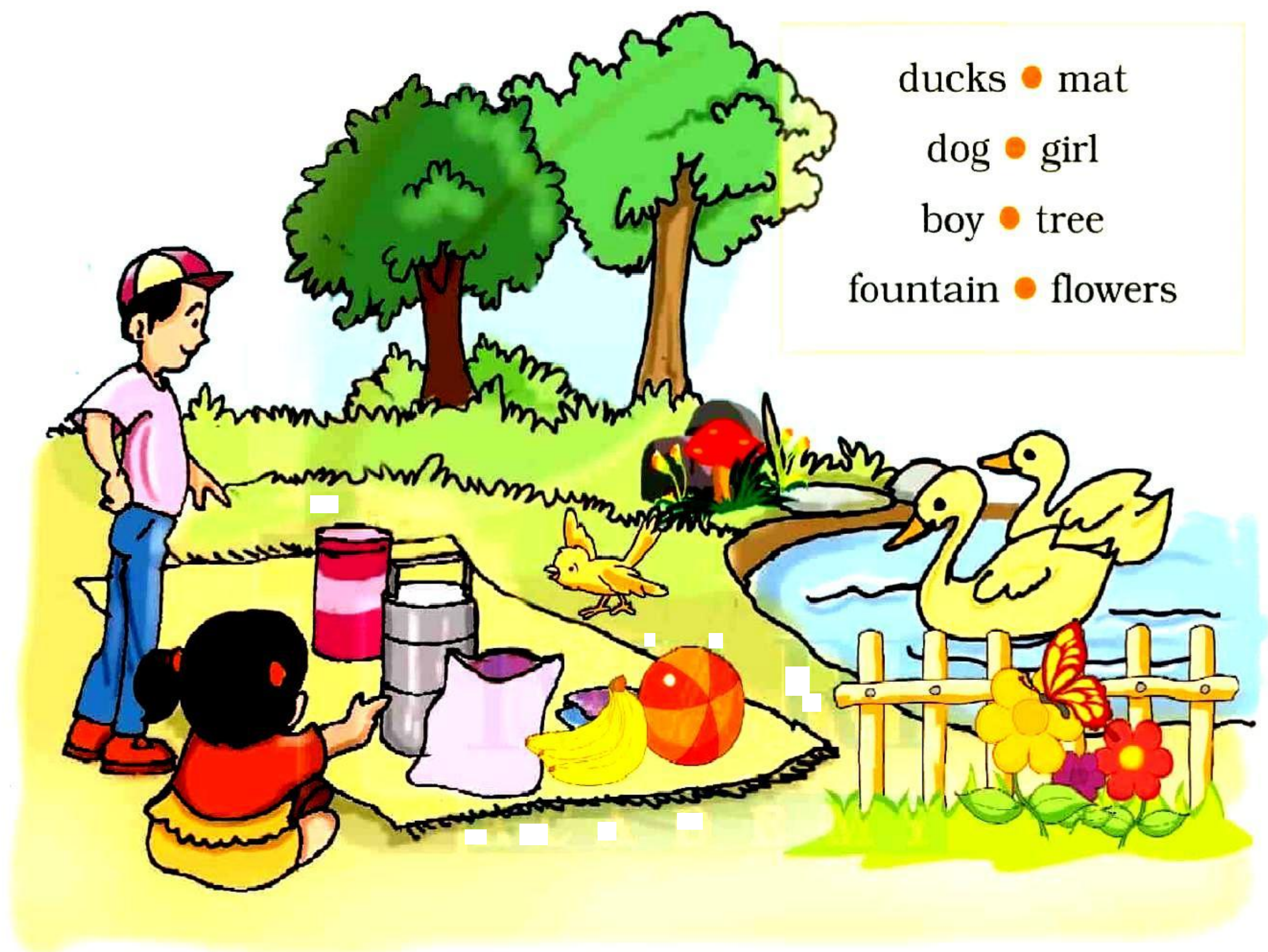
