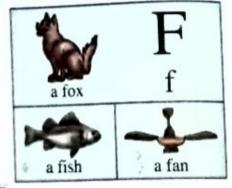




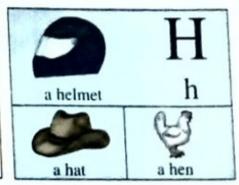


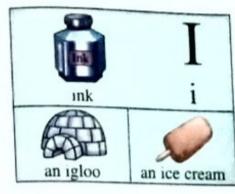


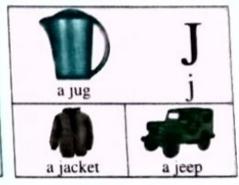




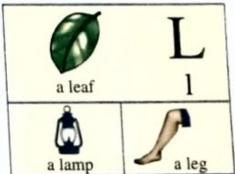


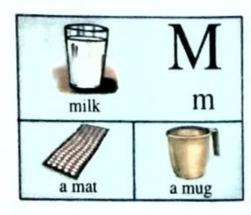


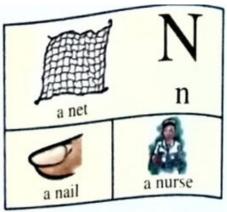


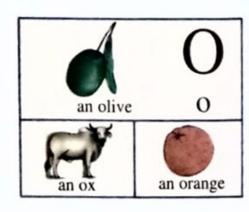


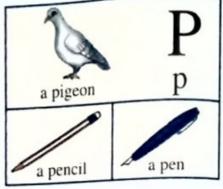


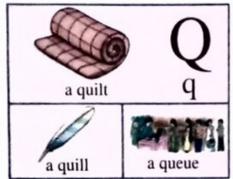






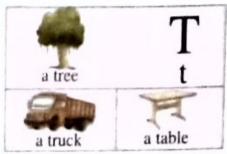




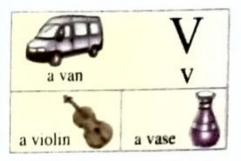


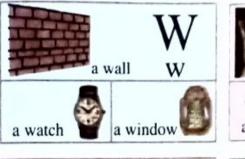


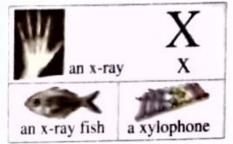




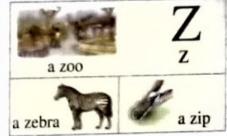














Lesson 4

For the Teacher

The listering activities which began in Lessons 1, 2 and 3 continue with the story of "The Dog and the Red Van" and further unfold the story of "The Wind and the Sun."

The teacher will relate the stories with correct pronunciation, voice modulation, gestures and to retell the stories.

Enhancing listening and speaking

The teacher will provide maximum opportunity to learners for listening to a lot of language input as well as speak or say what they see and hear. In order to develop listening and speaking skills in the learners, the teacher will help learners to look at pictures and talk about them. Teachers can provide a cue, by mentioning the names of some objects, some describing words, etc. Learners will repeat these words after the teacher and identify them in the pictures. Teachers will repeat and write the words that are found in the stories and other text on the blackboard, e.g. sun, wind, man, shawl, jacket, quarrel, van, coat, etc.

Rhyme time

The teacher will recite the poem in Activity 21-"Rain on the green grass.." with correct pronunciation and rhythm and the learners will recite and sing the same.

Teachers will introduce learners to prepositions 'in', 'on', 'under', etc.

Describing words

The teacher will explain how words like hot, cold, big are used. For example, a hot sun, a cold wind, a big dog, a small dog, a sad face, a happy face. This activity can be extended by the teacher to help learners describe themselves.

Games with words

The teacher may guide the learners to make as many words as they can from a grid that may be written on the blackboard. First, a word is made, then a phrase and lastly a sentence. For example, dog, a dog, A dog is running on the road.

Developing writing

The teacher will help learners to trace and write along the dotted curves, circles and lines on their slates and also to write the letters of the alphabet.

Learning outcomes: The learner-

- 1 responds orally to comprehension questions related to stories/poems
- 2. names familiar objects seen in the pictures
- 3 listens to English words, greetings, polite forms of expression, simple sentences and responds in English or the home language
- 4. recognises letters and their sounds in context
- associates words with pictures
- 6. recites poems/rhymes with action
- 7. differentiates between small and capital letters in print
- 8. uses prepositions in, on, under,etc.
- draws, scribbles in response to stories/poems
