

Sentence

A sentence is a group of words that conveys meaning. It must contain a subject and a verb.

Types of Sentences

There are four kinds of sentences

1. Declarative Sentence

It declares or states a fact, arrangement or opinion. Declarative sentences can be either **positive** or **negative**. A declarative sentence ends with a period or full stop (.) e.g.

1. The Sun rises in the East.

(Positive)

2. Humpty Dumpty sat on the wall.

(Positive)

3. He is not ready to go to school.

(Negative) (Negative)

4. Mr Sen is not a teacher.

2. Interrogative Sentence

In this type we ask a question.

- e.g. (a) Where do you live?
 - (b) Do you want a cup of tea?

In Interrogative type helping verb precides the subject which is followed by main verb. The sentence ends with a question mark (?).

- 1. When does the bus leave?
- 2. How long have you lived in France?
- 3. What will you have, tea or coffee?
- 4. Do you enjoy reading a book?

3. Imperative Sentence

Such type of sentences express commands, requests or entreaties.

- e.g. 1. Go to the market at once.
 - 2. Have mercy upon us.
 - 3. Pick up that book.
 - 4. Give me your pen, please.

4. Exclamatory Sentence

Such type of sentences express very strong feelings.

- e.g. 1. What a shame!
 - 2. That sounds fantastic!
 - 3. Bravo! We have won the match!
 - 4. Alas, he is no more!
