Practical Exercise 3

Objectives:

- 1. To develop the capacity of observation related to attributes of natural as well as manmade objects with special reference to **textures**.
- 2. To replicate 5 textures each from nature and man-made objects.
- 3. To learn basic presentation techniques.

Material Required:

- 1. White Cartridge sheet (size A3) 5.
- 2. Sunlit Bond sheets -10.
- 3. Colour pencils, wax crayon, chalk pastels, graphite pencils, ruler, scissor, glue.

Procedure:

- 1. Identify textures in the surrounding environment. In nature these could be found in flowers, tree bark, stones, shells etc. Man-made textures could be found in lifestyle products, buildings, fabrics etc.
- 2. Place a Sunlit Bond sheet on the textured object.
- 3. Transfer the texture by rubbing the pencil/ crayon/ chalk pastels over a 6" by 6" square of paper.
- 4. Experiment replication of textures with different kinds of art materials (pencils and crayons) using different colour schemes.
- 5. Categorize the textures into natural and man-made. Label them.
- 6. Mount them in cut-out of 6" x 6" square 'windows' in a notebook.

Observation and Discussion:

- 1. How pictures and advertisements of garments and home furnishings focus on textures and surface treatments/embroidery as the unique signature style of the brand.
- 2. How their Actual (Tactile) and Implied texture (Illusionary) contribute to the aesthetics of the product.
- 3. How fabric surfaces are inspired by a variety of sources.
