Lesson 6

For the Teacher

Children are attracted to mobile phones. Besides enriching learners with different vocabulary related to technology and communication, this lesson will introduce learners to the various functions of a mobile phone while developing their language skills.

Speaking

Teachers will help learners to recite the poem "I'm a Mobile Phone" at first in groups, then in pairs and finally they will be able to recite it individually with correct pronunciation, rhyme and rhythm.

Reading and Writing

Teachers will help learners to read the input provided in Activities 6 and 7 with comprehension and complete the Activities 7(b) and 8 by filling in the blanks with correct words.

Activity 9 is a reading as well as a writing exercise for practice of punctuation marks.

Vocabulary

Vocabulary related to communication and information will be introduced in this lesson and teachers will transact the activities with innovation and practical demonstration if possible.

Grammar focus

Activity 8 is an exercise that deals with the simple past tense forms of verbs. This activity is a continuation of a similar exercise in Lesson 2.

In Activity 11 teachers will help learners understand the use of opposite and describing words. They are also called describing words. Learners will be told that these words tell us something more about a naming word.

In Activity 12, teachers will help learners to use words like 'big' and 'small' in sentences of their own.

Learning Outcomes:

The learner -

- 1. recites poems individually /in groups with correct pronunciation and intonation.
- 2. responds appropriately to oral messages/telephonic communication.
- 3. reads small texts in English with comprehension i.e. identifies main idea, details and sequence and draws conclusions in English.
- 4. distinguishes between simple past and simple present tenses.
- 5. uses punctuation such as question mark, full stop and capital letters appropriately.
- 6. uses meaningful short sentences in English, orally and in writing, uses a variety of nouns, pronouns, adjectives and prepositions in context as compared to previous class.
- 7. identifies opposites like day/night, close/open and such others.
