Chapter 18: Too Much Water, Too Little Water

Question 1:

How can unclean or dirty water harm our body?

Answer 1:

Unclean or dirty water can cause many diseases in our body. These diseases are called water borne diseases. For example-diarrhea, Jaundice, typhoid etc.

Question 2:

Have you ever got dirty or unclean water in your area? What was the reason for this?

Answer 2:

Yes, Many times we have got unclean water in our area because of a leakage in the pipeline or sewage pipe getting mixed with water pipe etc.

Question 3:

Answer 3:

Yes, some of my cousin sister fell sick because of drinking such unclean water. She started suffering from loose motions and vomiting. Her stomach was upset and her face became pale and my aunt had to rush to the doctor immediately.

When the guest came to Suguna's house, they offered him a cold drink, because they thought he should not drink such water. What do you think Suguna's family must be doing for their own drinking water?

Answer 4:

I think Suguna's family must be cleaning the water through boiling it or putting alum/chlorine into the water in order to make it fit for drinking.

Question 5:

The guest said he did not take cold drinks. Why do you think he said this?

Answer 5:

The guest said this because aerated drinks like cold drinks are not good for health. They may cause issues in the digestive system of the body and are bad for our teeth too.

Question 13:

Answer 19:

Question 29:

How is water made safe for drinking?

Answer 29:

Water is made safe for drinking by filtration or boiling before it is used for drinking. Also, chlorine tablets and alum are used to purify the overhead tankers.

Question 30:

Is there a long-handled ladle to take water from the matka or container? How many ladles are there per container?

Answer 30:

Yes, ladles are available to take water from the matka or container. There is a ladle for each of the matkas / containers.

Question 31:

Is the place around the drinking water-taps or matkas cleaned regularly?

Answer 31:

Yes, the place around the drinking water-taps or matkas should be cleaned regularly to ensure that it does not become slippery or unhygienic too.

Question 32:

Why do the drinking water places get dirty?

Answer 32:

The drinking water places get dirty because when we go to fill water, it often gets spilled here and there when we are fetching or taking out water from the containers. These places also get dirty and slippery when people do other activities like washing around these places.

Question 33:

What can we do to keep these places clean?

Answer 33:

We can be more careful while taking out water from the containers so that the water does not spill around. Also, we can avoid activities like washing around these places.
