Today I shall introduce to a great son of Assam namely Lakshminath Bezbarua. His contribution towards Assamese language and literature were so great that he was fondly called Sahityarathi. His father Dinanath Bezbarua was a top government officer under British administration. His mother Thaneswari Devi was a housewife. He was born on the 'Lakshmi Purnima' day of 1864. Lakshminath had a colourful life. He was a businessman and an employee of a private company also. He spent most of his lifetime outside Assam. After spending first 22 years in Assam (1864-1886). He was in Kolkata for 30 years (1887-1917). Since 1917 he was at Sambalpur in Odisha for nearly 20 years. He died on 26th March, 1938 at Dibrugarh.

Lakshminath Bezbarua was a great litterateur. There is no branch of literature which he did not excel in. He was a patriot also. When Assamese literature stepped into modern age, Lakshminath enriched it by authoring books, publishing periodicals. He was the author of Assam's national song 'O Mor Aponar Desh'.
