# Explanations

- 1. a 'ABCD' is a mandatory sequence as it states what 'she' wanted and where did she want to reach (the top). Hence, option (a) is the correct answer.
- b 'BA' is the obvious opener as it gives us the subject of the sentence i.e. *making good technology decisions*. However, this can be found only in option (b). Hence, it is the correct option.
- 3. a 'CDE' is a mandatory sequence that follows B as it states what the training is provided for. Hence, option (a) is the correct answer.
- 4. c 'AB' provides the topic of the discussion i.e. *major IT projects* and 'DCE' states what they require. Hence, 'ABDCE' is the correct sequence.
- 5. d B follows A as it states what CEOs need to do stay current. 'CED' states the reason behind this to make sure their companies remain competitive. Hence, option (d) is the correct answer.
- 6. c Option (c) is the answer because women make an attempt to conceal flaws through stylishly cut garments.
- b 'unsettling', which means weakening or shaking is a result of bombing. Hence, option (b) is the correct answer.
- 8. a Option (a) is the answer because it rained so much that even Noah (of Noah's Ark) was scared.
- 9. d The sentence wants to convey the fact that one can be happy if one keeps low expectation from himself. Hence, option (d) i.e. *low* is the correct answer.
- 10. a Options (c) and (d) are illogical. We are looking for an answer that would be the opposite of 'hammer and tongs' which is (a).
- 11. d Choice (a) is wrong in usage because of the phrase 'the most attractive between'. *Between* is used

when two things are compared. In case of comparison of many things, among should be used. Choice (b) is wrong in using 'books in'. It should be 'books on' the bookshelf. Choice (c) uses a past continuous perfect tense 'having undoubtedly made' and hence the sentence seems awkward and incomplete. Thus, choice (d) is the correct answer.

- 12. c Choice (a) is awkward as children should be replaced by a pronoun. Choice (b) is wrong in using 'to assimilate'. The correct usage is 'of assimilating'. Choice (d) wrongly uses the phrase 'capable to assimilating'.
- 13. b The sentence has parallel construction. Hence, there is no need to repeat the subject.
- 14. b Choice (a) is wrong as it uses a redundant phrase 'that according to him'. Choice (c) has a double use of 'which' that makes it very awkward and confusing. Choice (d) also uses a 'which clause' that is unnecessary.
- 15. c Choice (a) is wrong as 'their' has no noun to refer to. Choice (b) is wrong as it uses a plural verb 'have' for a singular noun 'use of carpets'. Choice (d) by saying 'has contributed by' implies a positive contribution which is not the case.
- 16. c The noun 'web' is singular, so the verb is 'is'.
- 17. b 'Do not play cricket' should be used as the two subjects together are plural.
- 18. d It should be 'losses' for two companies.
- 19. c It should be 'revival' and not revive.
- 20. b The correct usage is 'good money after bad money'.
