

Franklin did not attend the school at all. Wright Brothers were not scientists but cycle mechanics. H.G. Wells was born in poverty and had to fight ill health continuously. It is how success does not necessarily depend on one's birth, environment and wealth etc.

The study of the great, successful, self-made men all over the world, whether of the past or of the present, spotlights very common factors. Firstly, they knew how to get along successfully with others. Then they knew how to sell themselves to strangers and friends, to their employers and employees, to their neighbours, families, infact to everyone with whom they came into contact daily. They knew how to

learn from others, from situations and from the available knowledge and wisdom. They knew how to sell their ideas, knowledge, talent and service. They knew how to get along with others, influence and motivate them and above all to convert their perceptions and ideas into reality.

Success depends to a great extent on what you do with your perception, ideas, talent and natural gifts. Invariably it is not what you know but what you do about what you know. It is not what you have, but what is done about it that spells the difference between success and failure.

Hardly anyone can positively enjoy sitting in a train for more than a few hours. Train compartments soon get cramped and stuffy. It is almost impossible to take your mind off the journey. Reading is the partial solution for the monotonous rhythm of the wheels clinking on. Sometimes it may lull you to sleep but for most it is only staring at the small blue light in the ceiling. You reach your destination almost exhausted.

Long car journeys are even less pleasant, for it is almost impossible to stretch out properly or reading a book. On motor-ways you can at least travel fairly safe at high speeds but more often most part of the journey may be spent on narrow and bumpy roads feeling jerks and pushes every now and then.

By comparison, trips by sea offer a great variety of civilized comforts. You can stretch, stand on the deck, play games, meet interesting people and enjoy a variety of food—always presuming that the sea remains calm. It is not, you are likely to get sea-sickness, which is very troublesome. Moreover sea-journeys take a long time and are a bit costly. Only a few people shall be prepared to sacrifice a large part of holidays for the pleasure of travelling on a ship.

Now, Aeroplanes have the reputation of being dangerous and very expensive. But nothing can match them for speed, comfort and saving much of time. It is an exhilarating experience at travel at a height of 30,000 feet far above the clouds. You can read comfortably and even watch a movie on a small screen before your seat and may enjoy a variety of drinks and food, as served on long flights. The journey is so smooth that nothing can stop you from reading or sleeping and above all you will reach your destination fresh and uncrumpled. However the mode of travel invariably depends upon one's choice, perceptions, likes and pocket.
