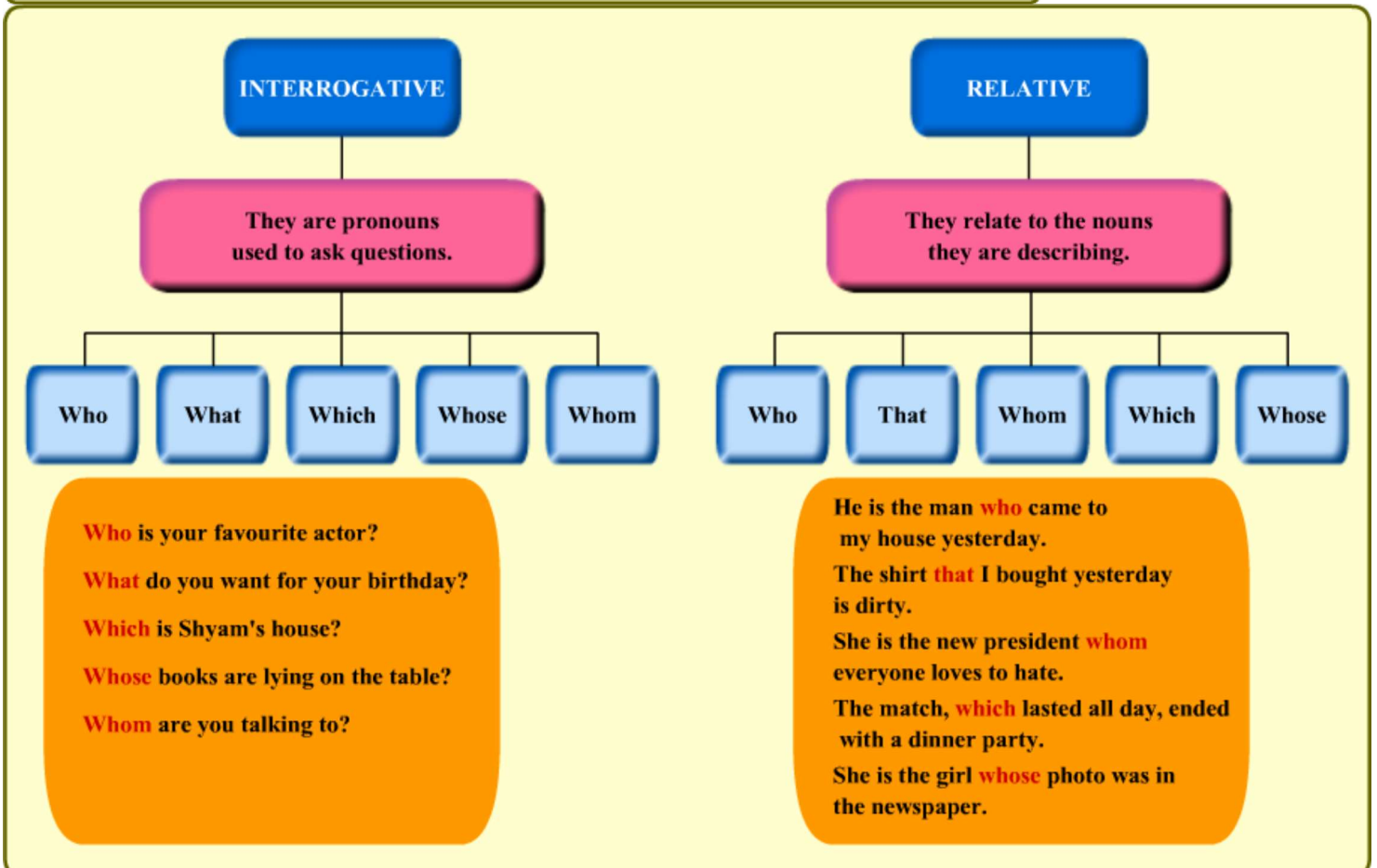
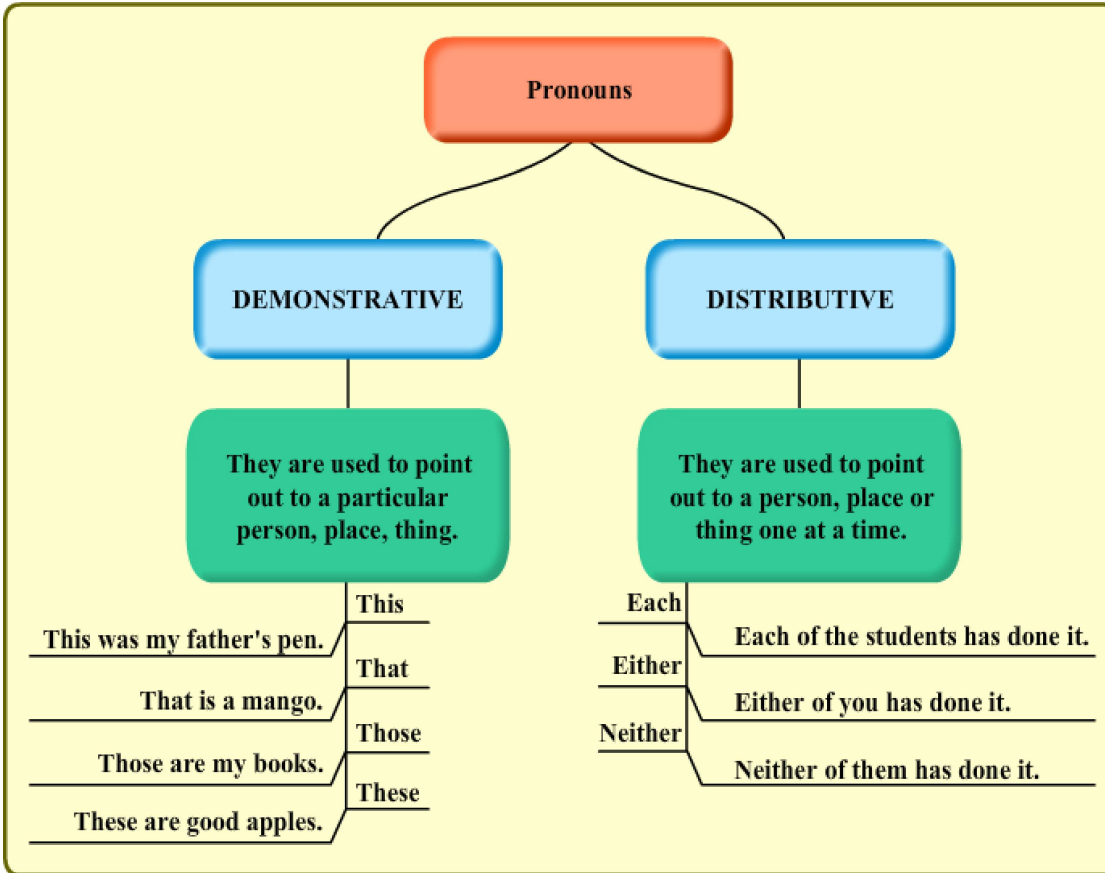


### 3. Pronouns



# PRONOUNS

Words that take place of a noun

They take place of a person or thing.

## PERSONAL

We

He

It

I

We are listening to some old songs.  
They are dancing in the rain.

They show ownership

## POSSESSIVE

Mine

His

Yours

Ours

The yellow painted house is his.  
The phone is yours.

## REFLEXIVE PRONOUNS

They are used when the object is same as the subject.

Myself

Ourselves

Itself

I was talking to myself.

We blamed ourselves for the loss.

The dog hid itself under the bed.

## EMPHATIC PRONOUNS

They are used when a reflexive pronoun is used for emphasis

Myself

Ourselves

Itself

I myself saw her throw it out of the window.

We cooked the dinner ourselves.

The city itself is quite polluted.

## INDEFINITE PRONOUNS

They do not refer to a particular, person or thing.

Someone

Anybody

Much

Someone has left the door open.

Nobody wants to hear about my problems.

Much has happened since then.
